


HISTORY XVII

Menorca had long been a top priority point for the British, who yearned for commercial maritime control of the Mediterranean and needed a supply point for their ships. Menorca lent itself to these needs, presenting in its orography two natural ports of great importance. That of Mahón, considered at the time the best port in the western Mediterranean.



And the port of Fornells, not inconsiderable in size. When in 1708 the British, commanded by Sir Edward Whitaker, began the conquest of Menorca from the north, they found a small fishing village that hardly resisted their advance: Fornells. The War of the Spanish Succession had divided the Spanish between the Bourbons and the Austrians, and the inhabitants of Menorca, mostly Aragonese far from their homeland, had never shown special sympathy for the French candidate, so they welcomed the British with open arms.



The British consummated their advance by bombarding the only defensive point in the north of Menorca, the Castillo de San Antonio, which had just been built just 40 years before. Faced with the incessant fire from the English cannons, the Franco-Spanish squadron that was occupying the position soon surrendered, and this is how the town that had grown up around it, Fornells, began a period of prosperity under the British occupation.


In fact, the British never came to understand how the Spanish Empire had underestimated and neglected a place as important for the control of the Mediterranean as Menorca. With the aim of preserving it at all costs, the English built a system of defensive towers along the entire coast. One of these towers was built not far from the still smoking ruins of the castle of San Antonio. A circular tower, with a rotating platform at its upper point, which could be defended with a reduced contingent and which was capable of repelling any incursion into Fornells Bay.





FORNELL'S TOWER

The Torre de Fornells is one of the many defense towers that surround the coast of Menorca. The one in Fornells was built between 1801 and 1802, in the last period of British domination, with the aim of guarding the entrance to the port of Fornells, preventing the landing of enemy ships and protecting the Castle of San Antonio. It consists of four levels. A cistern dug into the subsoil waterproofed with mortar.



A ground floor where weapons, ammunition and food were stored. The first floor where the garrison was staying. The upper floor, which was the artillery platform, where there was a small oven to heat the cannonballs until they were red hot with the aim of setting fire to the enemy ships. Under the parapet of this work of war engineering, the town of Fornells prospered until it became something similar to what we can find today. Although the British soldiers were expelled from the island after the signing of the treaty, the English one way or another never left the island completely.

But. Why did the British stay? The answer seems obvious: a mild climate, a privileged coastal relief... but also a unique gastronomy thanks to its abundant fishing.



LOBSTER'S TRADITION



Fornells has always been a fishing village where lobster is the star of different preparations, although the best known is the stew.

It is a seafood stew. Fishermen have already made it ancient times, as a poor dish, when this crustacean did enjoy the current reputation. Its restaurant tables passage to came, more than a century ago, thanks Burdó. Casa to establishment that has now disappeared, which rescued 120 years ago, giving it fame.

Today there are rare restaurants in this town that do not prepare them. It is a simple dish. The base is a sauce of garlic, onion, green pepper and a little tomato to which water is added. When it boils, add the lobster, cleaned and chopped. Undoubtedly the secret is in the cooking point of the crustacean. In any case, the lobster stew preparations vary from one place to another: there are those who add a minced garlic and parsley, those who add a splash of cognac or white wine, and those who add breadcrumbs or a little flour. to thicken the broth. At present there is control over lobster fishing and they can only extract it from April to September.

SANT ANTONI'S CASTLE

The castle of San Antonio is the genesis of the town of the bay of Fornells, a strategic enclave of the island, which was born linked to this fortification. 1637 is the year the construction of the castle began, during the reign of Felipe IV, until 1971. The castle had a square shape; approximately thirty meters long by twelve wide. At the four ends were located four bastions with the names of the four evangelists.



Inside there was a modest chapel, storerooms, a large cistern, housing troop and the quartermaster. In the center, a small parade ground. This fortification was destroyed in 1782, shortly after the island returned to Spanish hands, by order of Carlos III. Currently it has been restored and several underground galleries and remains of a bastion have been preserved. It was thanks to construction in the port of the Castillo de San Antonio in the 17th century, that the town of Fornells was born.

SAN ANTONIO ABAD'S CHURCH

The church of San Antonio Abad de Fornells, is a church located at number 2 Calle de las Escoles and acts as a local parish. It receives its name from the monk and Christian saint San Antonio Abad. The Church already XVII, the date of 1639 is given as the year of its construction, to serve the small suburb that served the Castle of San Antonio, although with the increase in population that Fornells experienced, it was expanded in the eighteenth century.

HERMITAGE OF LOURDES

The hermitage of Lourdes is a small hermitage that takes advantage of a natural cave. It is located at the northern end of the town of Fornells, on a path that starts from the car park located at the end of Calle de la Tramontana, and which ascends in a westerly direction towards the Fornells Tower.

THE TOWN

A fishing town of barely 1,000 inhabitants that, in times, was essential for the defense of the island against pirate incursions. thanks to its natural bay. As for urban planning, Fornells is the typical Mediterranean with narrow streets. town. whitewashed houses, with wooden doors and windows painted in bright colors.
